TEACHING GUIDE

INTRODUCTION

In this lesson, children have an opportunity to reflect on their home lives. They will think about what they like or dislike about home, what they find difficult, and what they would like to change.

Through this reflection, children formulate ideas on how to improve life for everyone and have a say in defining family laws. They gain a better understanding of why laws exist and how they benefit the family.

Children will also identify something that is difficult for them, whether it is a chore or a routine. With the family, they will role-play ways to make it easier. This is a great time to discuss responsibilities and how actions have results, sometimes consequences.

Using role-playing techniques, children are more likely to internalize their learning and understand why laws are needed.

Following these videos, discuss with children that:

- some things can be done or problems solved better as a family.
- Family Laws reflect the needs and values of the family and help things run smoother at home.
- Children (and adults) follow Family Laws, which hold everyone responsible for their actions and results.

CREAT WORK

LET'S DO

Tell children that in the "My Home Survey" activity, they will look at their daily routines and activities at home and come up with ways to make things better.

In the "Act it Out! Activity, they will then problem-solve one difficult situation and practice a way to make it easier through role-playing with family.

CLOSURE

Emphasize to childlren the importance of visualizing or imagining a better future while preparing to create Family Laws.
